

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were Ryan Weltmer, James Balthazor, Skylar Rudman, Deb Meyers, and Colton Wise.

All stood for the flag salute.

Deb Meyers moved to approve the consent agenda consisting of:

- January 17, 2023, regular meeting minutes
- Bills in the amount of \$68,872.02

Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Jeremy Jackson presented details of an voluntary employee benefit plan from Legal Shield. There were no objections from the Council on offering the voluntary benefit to City employees.

Rooks County Emergency Management Director Butch Post updated the Council as to the events over the last year.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- New trash dumpsters are needed. The cost will be approximately \$5,055.00.
 - ◆ Deb Meyers moved to allow the purchase of dumpster for a cost not to exceed \$5,500.00. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- Article 8 of the City Code that details regulating Massage Establishments, Bath Houses, And Modeling And Body Painting Studios should be reviewed. After discussion, the Council would like to remove Article 8. City Attorney Michael Baxter will bring an ordinance to the table updating the City Code at the next regular meeting.


Compliance Officer Daryl Sherraden reported:
