

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were Ryan Weltmer, Skylar Rudman, Colton Wise, Deb Meyers, and James Balthazor.

All stood for the flag salute.

Deb Meyers moved to approve the consent agenda consisting of:

- October 4, 2022, regular meeting minutes
- Bills in the amount of \$270,509.18

Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The Plainville Community Foundation (PCF) expressed its desire to retain the grant writer hired last year for various community developmental projects. They requested \$24,000.00 from the City that would be used for 12 months of personnel payments.

- Balthazor moved to donate \$24,000.00 in ARPA funds to the PCF for the purpose of retaining grant writing services for the community. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- Ordinance G-22-02 between Nex-Tech LLC and the City has been reviewed by the City Attorney and can be passed.
 - ◆ Weltmer moved to approve Ordinance G-22-02 as presented. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Fire Chief Craig Wise reported:

- The fire department's incident software needs to be replaced. A Fire Records Management System from ESO will cost \$1,590.00.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to approve the purchase of new software from ESO for \$1,590.00. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Compliance Officer Daryl Sherraden reported:

- Three building permits were presented for approval:
 - ◆ 209 S Plainville
 - ◆ 901 S 3rd
 - ◆ 801 S Wyoming
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to approve the permits as presented. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Public Works Supervisor Joe McCune reported:


- An invoice from Gorham Communication in the amount of \$2,792.00 needs approval.
