Sherraden moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from September 21, 2021. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Deb Meyers moved to pay bills in the amount of \$76,342.07.07. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Discussion and review was held of an updated employee handbook. Continued discussion will be held at the next regular meeting.

Mayor Quentin Meyers reported:

- City Prosecutor Danielle Muir has submitted her resignation. City Attorney Michael Baxter will research and bring recommendations for a replacement at the next meeting.

Police Captain Chris Davis reported:

- A police vehicle needs repairs with an estimated cost of \$1,570.00.
 - ◆ Sherraden moved to allow the repairs for a cost not to exceed \$1,600.00. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Public Works Supervisor Jerry Hageman reported:

- Water well number 13 has some electric issues that will need to be repaired.
- Drilling for water well number 23 is scheduled to begin on October 12th.
- The public works department has been fixing a number of water leaks throughout the City.


Compliance Officer Many Bice reported:
