

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers Council presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were Ryan Weltmer, James Balthazor, Matt Whitney, Skylar Rudman, and Frank Austin.

All stood for the flag salute.

Weltmer moved to approve the consent agenda consisting of:

- December 2, 2025, regular meeting minutes
- Bills in the amount of \$161,184.33

Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

A representative from Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Kansas reviewed the 2026 health insurance premiums for the City. After discussion:

- Rudman moved to approve the renewal of the current grandfathered health insurance plan as presented. Whitney seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The Neighborhood Revitalization Plan was presented for a three-year renewal.

- Weltmer moved to renew the plan as presented. Austin seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Resolution 254 dealing with the structure at 217 and 219 West Mill Street was presented.

- Austin moved to approve Resolution 254 as presented. Whitney seconded the motion. The motion passed.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- A Cereal Malt Beverage license for Mr. K's Foodtown from January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026 was presented.
 - ◆ Rudman moved to approve the license as presented. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- Transfers from the utility funds to the general and equipment reserve funds have been completed.
- Inquired if the Council would increase department head spending limits.
 - ◆ Austin moved to increase department head spending limits to \$2,000.00 before requiring Council approval. Whitney seconded the motion. The motion passed.

City Attorney Michael Baxter reported:

- Presented an agreement between the City and Downtown Plainville Inc.
 - ◆ Rudman moved to approve the agreement as presented. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Councilmember Ryan Weltmer reported:

- Hays Fire Equipment has given several equipment items to the department at no cost.
- The Fire Department requested that the City pay for spouses' menu items at their annual Christmas party. There was no objection from the Council.

Councilmember Matt Whitney reported:

- Moved to allow Mayor Quentin Meyers to personally retain the Governing Body gavel. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Balthazor moved to adjourn the meeting. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 7:43PM.
