

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were, Daryl Sherraden, Colton Wise, James Balthazor, Deb Meyers, and Skylar Rudman.

All stood for the flag salute.

Sherraden moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from February 15, 2022. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Deb Meyers moved to pay bills in the amount of \$90,139.29. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Lisa Gehring with USD 270 updated the Council as to the District's daycare and preschool plans. Water and Sewer taps will be required for two new facilities.

- Balthazor moved wave any water and/or sewer tap fees associated with building permit number 522. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Mayor Quentin Meyers reported:

- Would like to see a handicap parking spot located in the middle of the northern side of the 200 block of Mill Street.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- A new fund named Municipal Court Bonds has been created.
- There has been inquiry as to whether the City would fund a Physical Improvement Project again. There was no objection by the Council to possibly funding up to two projects based on applications received.

Police Chief Troy Rudman reported:

- Would like \$100.00 of each diversion fine to be deposited into the Special Police Fund. There was no objection.

Compliance Officer Mandy Bice reported:

- A compliance letter will be sent to 110 S Madison asking that the nuisance condition of the property be abated by March 14th or formal action will be taken.

Public Works Supervisor Joe McCune reported:


- Cleaning of the sewer lagoons will cost approximately \$2,700.00.
 - ◆ Sherraden moved to allow the cleaning for a cost not to exceed \$2,700.00. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Councilmember Daryl Sherraden reported:

- Suggested that swimming pool lifeguard beginning wage should be \$8.00 an hour with an added quarter for any returning lifeguard.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to set the beginning wage for lifeguards to \$8.00 an hour with an added quarter for any returning lifeguard. Wise seconded the motion. The motion passed.

- An executive session to discuss personnel issues was requested.
 - ◆ Sherraden moved to recess into executive session with the Governing Body and City Attorney Michael Baxter to discuss matters relating to non-elected personnel, to protect the privacy of those involved, and to return to open meeting in the Council Chamber at 8:05 PM. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.
 - ◆ The Governing Body and City Attorney Michael Baxter returned to the Council Chamber at 8:05 PM with no action taken.

Balthazor moved to adjourn the meeting. Sherraden seconded the motion. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 8:09 PM.
