

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Council President Daryl Sherraden presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were, Colton Wise, James Balthazor, and Skylar Rudman. Mayor Quentin Meyers and Councilmember Deb Meyers were absent.

All stood for the flag salute.

Balthazor moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from March 15, 2022. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Balthazor moved to pay bills in the amount of \$178,377.41. Sherraden seconded the motion. The motion passed.

A representative from Western Kansas Child Advocacy Center updated the Council as to the services rendered throughout their territory for the year 2021.

- Balthazor moved to donate \$2,000.00 to the Western Child Advocacy Center. Wise seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Representatives from Downtown Plainville Incorporated addressed the Council as to their concerns regarding the City's utility shutoff procedures with businesses. The City can review and adjust the policy if needed.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- Presented the 2021 Financial Statements.
- Estimates for a furnace replacement were discussed. No action taken.

Fire Chief Craig Wise reported:

- The Fire Department has been awarded a grant in the amount of \$25,000.00 from Coffeyville Resources for the acquisition of new rescue tools.
- Truck #512 needs repairs costing approximately \$3,000.00.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to allow the repairs for a cost not to exceed \$3,000.00. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Public Works Supervisor Joe McCune reported:

- Has received a Class 2 Water Operations certification.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to increase McCune's hourly wage by \$.50 per hour. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- Needs to purchase chemical for the swimming pool.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to allow the purchase of swimming pool chemical not to exceed \$8,000.00. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

- Would like to purchase a used pick-up truck for the public works department. The estimated cost should not exceed \$35,000.00.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to allow the purchase of a used truck for the public works department for a cost not to exceed \$35,000.00. Wise seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Balthazor moved to adjourn the meeting. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 8:02 PM.
