

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were Daryl Sherraden, James Balthazor, Colton Wise, Ryan Weltmer, and Deb Meyers.

All stood for the flag salute.

Sherraden moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from April 20, 2021. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Deb Meyers moved to pay bills in the amount of \$85,948.91. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Mayor Quentin Meyers recommended Troy Rudman for Chief of Police, Michael Baxter for City Attorney, Douglas Bigge for City Municipal Judge, Jim Mesecher for City Administrator/Clerk, Lorrie Bland for Assistant City Clerk, Cassandra Nuckols for City Treasurer, Craig Wise for Fire Chief, Ryan Cellmer for City Fire Department Secretary-Treasurer, 1st State Bank and Astra Bank as Depository of City Funds, and the Plainville Times as the Official City Newspaper.

- Balthazor moved to accept and appoint all recommendations. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Andrew Casey with the Plainville Recreation Commission (PRC) presented a proposed estimate for retrofitting the existing lighting fixtures to LED fixtures. Casey let the Council know that the PRC will be researching and pursuing grant options.

Resolution Number 230 was presented.

- Sherraden moved to approve Resolution Number 230 as presented. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Brett Greenwood addressed the Council about the planned bicycle activities during the Paradise Creek Festival. He asked if the Police Department would be able to help with traffic and if the participants would have use of the showers at the pool if necessary. There were no objections to the requests.

Richard Palmberg asked if the City would care to contribute to the Saddle Club for the upcoming rodeo. There was no objection to a \$350.00 donation.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- Have spoken with Mike Younger with EBH Engineering about the different water project options which will be detailed in the Preliminary Engineering Report.
- Northwest Kansas Planning and Development will be writing and submitting a CDBG CARES Act funding grant for the City. There will be an as advertised public hearing at the May 18th regular meeting.

Public Works Supervisor Jerry Hageman reported:

- The driver's door on a City truck needs repaired.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to allow the repair for a cost not to exceed \$3,000.00 from Jade Classics. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- Will be getting prices for the replacement of a sewer lift station.

Police Chief Troy Rudman reported:

- The VFW would like an event license for June 12, 2021.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to approve the license for June 12, 2021 beginning at 12:00 AM and ending at 11:59 PM. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed with Sherraden voting nay.


Fire Chief Craig Wise reported:
