

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were Daryl Sherraden, Colton Wise, Ryan Weltmer, and Deb Meyers. James Balthazor joined the meeting at 7:09 PM.

All stood for the flag salute.

Sherraden moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from May 18, 2021. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Deb Meyers moved to pay bills in the amount of \$86,509.94. Sherraden seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Roger Hrabe with Rooks County Economic Development updated the Council as to the various past, present, and future activities and plans within Rooks County.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- Several light fixtures in City Hall have quit working and need replaced. Blaine's Electric estimated a cost of \$2,620.00 to replace the old florescent fixtures with LED fixtures.
  - ◆ Balthazor moved to accept the estimate for replacement of light fixtures from Blaine's Electric in the amount of \$2,620.00. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- An invoice from K-Lawn for weed spraying at the ball fields in the amount of \$2,345.72 needs approval.
  - ◆ Balthazor moved to approve the invoice from K-Lawn in the amount of \$2,345.72. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- An invoice from Ali Hadley for instructing lifeguard certifications in the amount of \$1,425.00 needs approval.
  - ◆ Sherraden moved to approve the invoice from Ali Hadley in the amount of \$1,425.00. Wise seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- The Fire Department needs approval to purchase bunker gear with grant and City funds.
  - ◆ Sherraden moved to allow the purchase of bunker gear not to exceed \$50,000.00. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.


Public Works Supervisor Jerry Hageman reported:
