

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:11 PM. Council Members present were Skylar Rudman, James Balthazor, and Deb Meyers. Colton Wise was absent.

All stood for the flag salute.

Balthazor moved to approve the Regular Council Minutes from May 17, 2022. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Deb Meyers moved to pay bills in the amount of \$170,698.72. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Bee Reif submitted a Physical Improvement Project application for her business. She also asked if the City would like to sponsor the bounce house attraction during the Paradise Creek Festival. The cost would be \$394.80. After discussion:

- Balthazor moved to approve and fund the application as presented. Rudman seconded the motion passed.
- City Attorney Michael Baxter will format the agreement documents and have them signed by all parties.
- There was no objection to a sponsorship for the discussed amount.

Roger Kriley addressed the Council with concerns as to the number of four-wheelers driving the City's streets. The Council asked the City Attorney to research the possibility of making changes to the City's current code.

City Attorney Michael Baxter is researching if any changes will need, or should be made, to the franchise agreement between Nex-Tech and the City.

Mayor Quentin Meyers would like Councilmember James Balthazor to represent the City as part of Redbug Village's board. There were no objections.

City Administrator/Clerk Jim Mesecher reported:

- Refinancing of the City's Bond is no longer financially productive due to poor interest rates due to inflation.

Police Chief Troy Rudman reported:

- Recommended hiring Daryl Sherraden as a Compliance Officer with a starting wage of \$16.00, increasing to \$16.50 after 60 days, and with benefits to start as soon as possible.
 - ◆ Rudman moved hire Sherraden as discussed. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.


Public Works Supervisor Joe McCune reported:

- Thad Helmuth has passed, and is now certified, as a Class I Water Operator.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to increase Helmuth's wage by \$.50. Deb Meyers seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- Pool has been opened for public use.
- A mechanical part used for the injection of chlorine into the pool needs replaced and will cost \$1,655.37.
 - ◆ Deb Meyers moved to allow the purchase as discussed. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- Street repair materials from APAC will cost \$1,778.85.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to allow the purchase of street repair materials as discussed. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Councilmember James Balthazor reported:

- Will attend the Palco City Council Meeting to discuss mutual aid response between Plainville and Palco's Fire Departments.

Balthazor moved to adjourn the meeting. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed. The meeting was adjourned at 8:21 PM.
