

The City Council of the City of Plainville met in regular session at the City Hall with Mayor Quentin Meyers presiding. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 PM. Council Members present were Ryan Weltmer, Skylar Rudman, James Balthazor, Colton Wise, and Deb Meyers.

All stood for the flag salute.

Balthazor moved to approve the consent agenda consisting of:

- August 16, 2022, regular meeting minutes
- Bills in the amount of \$129,373.06
- KanEquip Inc. invoice \$2,824.09

Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The Public Hearing to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate as published on the City's website and in the July 14, 2022, issue of the Plainville Times was opened at 7:01 PM. There were no public comments.

- Resolution 235, a resolution to exceed the revenue neutral rate, was presented.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to accept and approve Resolution 235 as presented. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed after a roll call vote of the entire Governing Body was taken with every member voting aye.
- The Public Hearing to exceed the Revenue Neutral Rate was closed at 7:03 PM.

The Public Hearing for the 2023 Budget as published on the City's website and in the July 14, 2022, issue of the Plainville Times was opened at 7:03 PM. There were no public comments.

- The Public Hearing for the 2023 Budget was closed at 7:04 PM.
 - ◆ Weltmer moved to approve the 2023 Budget as presented. Balthazor seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Shirley Steinert addressed the Council stating she has found some support of her desire to have the City Code changed for the allowance of placing shipping containers on residential property.

Dan Steffan with Northwest Kansas Planning and Development asked that the Public Hearing for the Community Development Block Grant number 21-CV-137 be opened as advertised.

The Public Hearing to close the CDBG number 21-CV-137 was opened at 7:15 PM. There were no public comments.

- Deb Meyers moved to close the public hearing at 7:18 PM. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.

Public Works Supervisor Joe McCune reported:

- Several large valves located at the water tower need replacement.
 - ◆ Weltmer moved to allow the purchase of materials for valve replacement for a cost not to exceed \$7,000.00. Wise seconded the motion. The motion passed.

- An inventory of the types of water piping entering each structure within the City's limits may need to be performed in the future.
- Would like to hire Levi Morgan to fill the vacant position within the department.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to allow the hiring of Levi Morgan for a wage of \$16.50 per hour with a \$.50 increase after a 90-day probationary period, with health benefits to start as soon as possible. Rudman seconded the motion. The motion passed.
- Jay Hrabec has passed the Class I wastewater certification testing.
 - ◆ Balthazor moved to increase the wage of Jay Hrabec by \$.50 per hour. Weltmer seconded the motion. The motion passed.


Compliance Officer Daryl Sherraden reported:
